

E-Resources Awareness Sessions for Students

Library has been instrumental in conducting sessions for students for raising the awareness levels about significance of e-resources in academics and research. The sessions focus on the N-LIST resources made available by INFLIBNET, that have been subscribed by the college for the students and teachers. The sessions include explanation as well as demonstration on how to search the articles and e-books from the different publishers' websites. The sessions are customised according to the course to which the participating students belong and the subjects covered in their curriculum. The sessions are organised in collaboration with different departments.







Profiles in Excellence - Nobel Laureates All: 1901-2015, by P.T. Rajasekharan and Arun Tiwari, Published by Panther Publishers Pvt. Ltd., 2019, Hardbound, ISBN - 978-93-7787-128-4, 508 pages, Rs. 800/-


115 years of Nobel Prizes is a tribute to over 150 years of the best of human achievements in Science, Literature and Humanity. 900 individuals and institutions 201 in Physics, 172 in Chemistry 210 in Medicine, 112 in Literature 129 in Peace and 76 in Economics have been recognized with the Prize so far and a journey through their lives and work is a search for human excellence and accomplishments of civilization as it exists today.

Salient features between the pages of this book are - Alfred Nobel and his legacy, The Nobel Phenomenon, Individual contributions of all the 900 Nobel Laureates from 1901 to 2015, Photographs of all the Nobelists, Brief biography of the Laureates, Over 115 years of scientific progress that profiles each award winning work, A complete index of the Laureates for cross reference.



The Seven Deadly Sins of Management: How to be a Virtuous Manager, by Jonathan Ellis and Rene Tissen, Publisher: Profile Books Ltd., London, 2004, Paperback, ISBN – 9781861975263, 208 Pages, Rs. 225/-

Lust, Wrath, Sloth, Covetousness, Gluttony, Envy, Pride - just as the seven deadly sins conspire to destroy our soul in daily life, so they conspire to bring down our business. This book contains warnings about current management practice and thinking, exposing the underlying sins that have led to the mediocre performance of so many managers and companies, or even to corporate failure. Examples of saints and sinners in the business world, along with a 'sin-o-meter', enable you to discover your management sin rating. And there is a wealth of helpful advice on how to avoid the seven deadly sins of management in the future. At a time when there is much criticism of the way business is conducted, this book provides invaluable lessons on how important it is for managers to reconsider their attitudes and methods.



Beyond Violence, by J. Krishnamurti, published by Krishnamurti Foundation India, Chennai, 2008, Paperback, ISBN – 81-87326-27-1, 194 pages, Rs. 20/-

J. Krishnamurti says, 'Violence is like a stone dropped in a lake: the waves spread and spread, at the centre is the 'me'. As long as the 'me' survives in any form, very subtly or grossly, there must be violence.'

The theme of 'violence' and Krishnamurti's approach to it are as relevant today as that were when he spoke in 1970 to vast audiences. In discussing the nature of violence, Krishnamurti also unravels the other psychological factors, such as hurt, competition, insecurity, and fear, which are closely related to violence. He shows us a way of looking at the fact of violence directly, without condemning, suppressing, or analyzing it, and thus going beyond it. In doing so, he calls for a fundamental change in the human psyche, which is the mark of a truly religious mind.

The book contains authentic reports of talks and discussions in 1970 in Santa Monica, San Diego, London, Brockwood Park (England) and Rome.
