The College Library has updated its E-Resources webpage on the library website to cope up with the increasing demand for electronic resources. The E-Resources page provides information and links to subscribed as well as open access resources. College Library subscribes to the N-LIST programme i.e. (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) of INFLIBNET. This is a College component of the e-ShodhSindhu Consortium. N-LIST Programme is being jointly executed by the e-ShodhSindhu Consortium, INFLIBNET Centre and the INDEST-AICTE Consortium, IIT Delhi. This programme gives access to more than 6,000+ e-journals and more than 1,99,500+ ebooks under N-LIST and 6,00,000 ebooks through NDLI as mentioned on the N-LIST Website. It covers subject areas like humanities, social sciences, physical sciences, chemical sciences, biological sciences, medical sciences, mathematical sciences, law, history, political sciences, linguistics, literature, to mention a few. A step-by-step user guide to use N-LIST resources is also available on the E-Resources webpage.

Apart from the N-LIST programme, the E-resources Webpage provides links to a huge number of open access eresources. They have been carefully curated into ebooks, ejournals, e-theses, databases, digital libraries, rare books, manuscripts, etc. There are many resources available that are helpful for the newly added course - 'Indian Knowledge Systems', introduced under the National Educational Policy 2020. The webpage provides access to more than 110 crore freely downloadable authentic, reliable digital documents.

All these e-resources are available **24 X 7** through **REMOTE ACCESS** on the user's devices - Desktops, Laptops, and Mobile phones. E-Resources are now available 'Any Time', Any Where' & 'Any Device'. Students are requested to make optimum use of these e-resources for their curriculum based studies, for research activities, as well as for fulfilling any other information seeking requirement. mend books to others. There is no barrier on the genre.

Every session has a surprise element — an activity that involves all participants and triggers discussions. Another element of BoOks n' BeyOnd is that the entire session is organised and conducted by students for the students. The Librarian is involved in guiding the students throughout the planning and implementation process, and also is present throughout every session. This allows free flow of thoughts among the new generation readers, aiming at taking the students beyond the reading resources and helping to build a strong personality and character in each student.

**Session - 1: 26-July-2023**, Venue: Multimedia Section (Library), Participants: 15

**Session - 2: 13-Sept-2023**, Venue: Reference Section in Library, Participants: 12

Some of the popular recommendations were Book Lovers by Emily Henry, Diary of a Young Girl by Anne Frank, The Secret by Rhonda Byrne, Parigh by Sudha Murthy, Adam by Ratnakar, Thinking, Fast and Slow by Daniel Kahneman, and A Brief History of Time by Stephen Hawking and many others. Podcast recommendation for 7 habits of successful people by Jay Shetty, ANI podcast by Smita Prakash and Poems by Megha Rao were also shared. The Secrets of the Universe and Astrokobi were some of the YouTube channels suggested for astrophiles. Recommendations led to numerous discussions from astronomy, astrology, star gazing, science fiction, to psychological behaviors and political podcasts.

'BoOks 'n BeyOnd' was born after ideation from Ms. Janhavi Rane and Ms. Payal Shah; and a series of discussions with the Librarian that ran through Feb-2023 to July-2023.




Review / Overall Impression / My Opinion about the book:

"The whole thing is a complicated, unlikely story. Perhaps that's because what we think stories are about often isn't what they're about at all."

Having no idea what I was getting myself into, this book ended up being my impulse buy. On a surface, this seems to be a typical hostage drama. But it has a lot more to it. When an apartment viewing ends up becoming a classic 'failed' bank robbery, a group of mismatch hostage strangers wind up together in an apartment. Each with their own stories, behaviours, fears and mistakes. Just a bunch of anxious little people.

These strangers seem to be insufferable. Not being able to stand the presence of each other at times. But as they are held hostage, the pressure mounts and they begin to open up to each other. Brace yourself to ride an emotional rollercoaster as Fredrik takes you on this journey of understanding and embracing the differences of human beings. Every character is flawed in their own way. You start off with hating every single one of them, but end up loving them wholeheartedly. While every character seems to carry a load and a million unsaid things, the beautifully woven conversations take a turn that warms your heart.

A blend of heartbreaking moments, unbelievable realities and hearty humour, Anxious People is a book worth every minute of your life. What seems to be a ridiculous plot, this





story has much more to offer. It is about people. People and life. And how it can be difficult to just be alive at times. But c'est la vie. All we can do, is understand the beauty of imperfect perfections.

#### What I liked? What I did not like about this book?

The book does start off very slow and bland. So, it might take a little time for readers to warm up to the story and characters. For someone like me who adores fast-paced books, this was a little difficult to get through the first half. But to be honest, what is there to not like about a book that makes you study and relate to people more and more as the story advances?

## Whether I would like to recommend this book to others? (Yes/No), Why?

I would without a doubt recommend this book to everyone who is reading this write up. Everyone needs a reminder that we human beings are meant to be different, flawed and 'insufferable' at times. That is what makes us humans. This book is the definition of this reality.

#### Takeaway of this book:

We all deserve second chances and mutual understanding. Even if it is with subtle gestures, we all deserve to be understood. If we all just open our hearts a little bit more, it won't be that difficult to handle those loads of emotions all the time.



Date: 29-Sept-2023





### Review / Overall Impression / My Opinion about the book:

Chitra Banerjee Divakaruni narrates the story of Ramayana through the eyes of Sita. The division of incident wise chapters makes it undemanding for the reader to pursue the novel. Little full grown tree stamps towards the end of sections adds to the forestry energy while reading.

In the prologue itself, Sita says, "I set quill to leaf. In the red ink I began to write - in crooked, effortful lettering because it had been so long since I'd composed anything the Sityan". With this, the glorious story begins and Banerjee's narrations have flowed like a poem throughout.

She adds that the inspiration has been brought down by Valmiki and Kamban's Ramayanas and the 15th-century Bengali Krittibasi Ramayan keeping the story as it is in the first person and not fictionalising it.

While the story resonates even today, and raises questions like, Is this how women are loved? What are the duties of women? How do men treat women? The stories of these powerful yet compelling women Kaikeyi, Mandodari, Manthara, Urmila, Kaushalya, Sumitra, Ahalya and many others have set some great examples of the way women set their foot on Mother Earth. With respect to Ramayana, Banerjee has kept the story alive in its true sense and gave hope to all the women out there who suffered.

As Amitav Ghosh mentions on its cover page, "One of the strikingly lyrical voices writing about the lives of Indian women" remains nothing but the truth.

This novel is purely a work of grace and power, duties and

betrayal, struggles and privileges. As the story proceeds, the author takes the reader through varied emotions of pain, sorrow, joy and distress.

Being the first time reader to read this version of Banerjee's Ramayan, I feel classified amongst the crowd. These lives of Indian women have set an epitome that I worship till the date. This is Sita for me.

#### What I liked? What I did not like about this book?

The narrations are not at all rigid which makes the reader to tail the story from every angle possible and thus, every reader may model it in its own way. Another thing I find courageous of Banerjee to pen down this work of art and quilt the shallow and underlying sentiments avidly.

## Whether I would like to recommend this book to others? (Yes/No), Why?

After finishing my first novel by Banerjee, Palace of Illusions, which is equally resplendent and majestic, I then got my hands on 'Forest of Enchantments'. For a person like me who has not even watched Ramanand Sagar's Ramayan, this is a great chance for you to understand this mythology in its pure form. For some this book might offend their sentiments as today we worship the characters from this book as deities.

#### Takeaway of this book:

As a student of Human Resource management, I studied a few strategies of Ram and understood how he had a major influence towards his subjects and kingdom. While undetermined tactics of Ravan closely required a different thought processing according to me. Overall, if one has to say, Ramayan is surprising every time you study and so is this book.






