BoOks 'n BeyOnd' is a new activity started by the Library this academic year to celebrate the **Ruby Jubilee** year of the college.

'**BoOks 'n BeyOnd'** involves free interactions and discussions among students based on whatever they have read or watched. It may include books, magazines, e-books, audio books, podcasts, Youtube videos, documentaries, etc. anything that can be considered a knowledge resource. The participants are free to express themselves about the books, their memories about the books, the way in which books have influenced them, and also recommend books to others. There is no barrier on the genre.

Every session has a surprise element – an activity that involves all participants and triggers discussions. Another element of BoOks n' BeyOnd is that the entire session is organised and conducted by students for the students. The Librarian is involved in guiding the students throughout the planning and implementation process, and also is present throughout every

Further, everyone recommended as well as discussed books that were being read. The participants were then involved in suggesting ideas and improvements for the forthcoming sessions of Books 'n Beyond.



Review / Overall Impression / My Opinion about the book:


'Pyjamas are Forgiving', a book by Twinkle Khanna is an easy read. The story of the book revolves around the life of a girl called Anshu and her ex-husband Jay. The whole story is narrated by the girl, Anshu when she is in a rehabilitation centre called 'Shanthamaaya' along with her ex-husband, Jay and his current wife. It tells us how Anshu and Jay became close again but even though, lately, how things turned out bad again. The couple used to call each other 'Juju and Bibet'. The story is well narrated with many comic incidences. The story has been conveyed in 20 chapters without title and an index. The font is fascinating to read.

What I liked? What I did not like about this book?

The really liked the reason of the title of the book. The book has a usual story of a divorced couple falling in love again. One red flag about the book is that sometimes, the link is lost and the reader gets blank at places.

Whether I would like to recommend this book to others? (Yes/No), Why?

The book has a comic-romantic story. It gives a lesson to how to let go off the past, how to move on from the grudges and focus on the future through the life of the protagonist, Anshu.



Review / Overall Impression / My Opinion about the book:

Viktor Frankl's book 'Man's Search for Meaning' is one of the precious books of our time. In fact, if there is an idea in any book, even a single passage that can change a person's life, then it is justified to read that book, read it again and bring it home and give that book a place of honor in your bookshelf. There are many such passages, many such ideas in this book.

First, this book is existential. In the 1930s, among Jews in Germany and many countries of Eastern Europe, 'we are



generally safe in Europe, although there is some hostility in people's behavior.' This feeling prevailed, with those people Frankl and his family were trapped in the network of concentration camps and extermination centers spread by the Nazis. By some inexplicable combination, as written in the Bible, Viktor Frankl was 'saved like a stick taken out of a net.' In addition to his pain and what he has lost, the book considers the sources of his strength to exist. In this book, Frankl often quotes his favorite philosopher, Nietzsche. 'He who knows what to live for can endure anything. This verse, with a very distressed heart, he describes those first to die. Frankl

Panorama 35 - Theme: 'Anti-Corruption'




Date: 09-Dec-2023







maintained his own will to live. For that, He used things like thoughts of love for his wife, hopes and desires to see her again, dreams of telling others what he had learned from his terrible experiences here. Of course it is true that many who had a strong desire to live did not. Some succumbed to disease and some were killed by electric furnaces. Frankl emphasizes why no one lived, rather than why many died.

It implies a recognition that the book is as religious as it is scientific. This book insists that life is meaningful and we must learn to find meaning in any situation. Our lives have a noble purpose. This book teaches you to recognize 'it' (meaning of life)

What I liked? What I did not like about this book?

I really appreciate the story of author. As it's not any kind of an imaginative aspect but it's based on true experiences that Frankl has been faced. I loved the book because the book takes us towards the psychological aspect.. Yes, there are some references which I think unwanted. But for author,

it may be mandatory to describe it. The courage that he has shown throughout the experiences are so appreciable. That's more impressive for me!!

Whether I would like to recommend this book to others? (Yes/No), Why?

Yes, I would do like to recommend this book to those who have lost their own meaning & are trying to find the meaning. Everyone's purpose is to live a life happily through each moment. But whatever Frankl had been faced, was fully horrible & unimaginable. Those who always feel that his or her life is meaningless, do read this book, it will make meaningful to your soul, to your happiness, not only life but every small moment of life.

Takeaway of this book:

For me, this book has become big amount of inspiration. And most significantly what I personally feel that, if the author preserves the human being by thinking of others with himself, and shapes the lives of others with himself, I think the life of every common man among us will continue to ring with joy.







In researching this book, the authors interviewed the residents of the Japanese village with the highest percentage of 100-year-olds- one of the world's Blue Zones. *Ikigai* reveals the secrets to their longevity and happiness: how they eat, how they move, how they work, how they foster collaboration and community, and their best-kept secret- how they find the *ikigai* that brings satisfaction to their lives. And it provides practical tools to help you discover your own *ikigai*. Because who doesn't want to find happiness in every day?

According to the Japanese, everyone has an *ikigai*—a reason for living. And according to the residents of the Japanese village with the world's longest-living people, finding it is the key to a happier and longer life. Having a strong sense of *ikigai*—where what you love, what you're good at, what you can get paid for, and what the world needs all overlap—means that each day is infused with meaning. It's the reason we get up in the morning. It's also the reason many Japanese never really retire.



Misbehaving: The Making of Behavioural Economics by Richard H. Thaler, Publisher: Penguin Books, UK, 2015, Paperback, ISBN: 978-0-241-95122-4, 429 pages, Rs.699/-

Nobel laureate Richard H. Thaler has spent his career studying the radical notion that the central agents in the economy are humans—predictable, error-prone individuals. *Misbehaving* is his arresting, frequently hilarious account of the struggle to bring an academic discipline back down to earth—and change the way we think about economics, ourselves, and our world.

Traditional economics assumes rational actors. Early in his research, Thaler realized these Spock-like automatons were nothing like real people. Whether buying a clock radio, selling basketball tickets, or applying for a mortgage, we all succumb to biases and make decisions that deviate from the standards of rationality assumed by economists. In other words, we misbehave. More importantly, our misbehavior has serious consequences. Laced with antic stories of Thaler's spirited battles with the bastions of traditional economic thinking, *Misbehaving* is a singular look into profound human foibles. When economics meets psychology, the implications for individuals, managers, and policy makers are both profound and entertaining.
