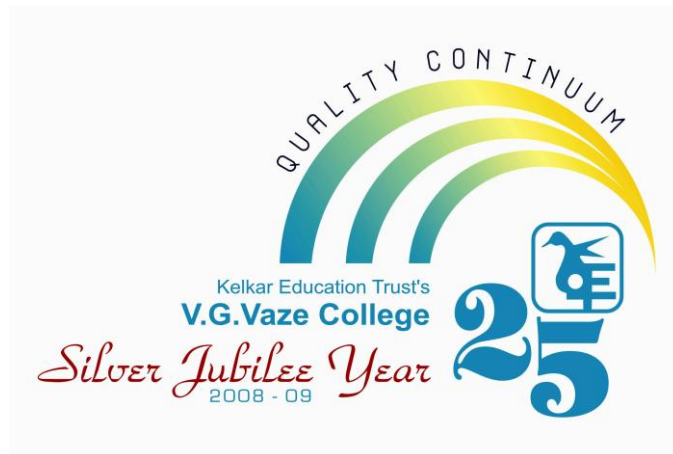

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Preamble

1.0 Mission

“To contribute to the sustainable development and improvement of society, by educating youth to enable them to become highly qualified and mature men and women, able to meet the needs of all the facets of human activities”.

Apart from imparting in-depth knowledge, developing crucial and analytical abilities, and social, cultural and aesthetic values in the students, the management is keen about the development of capabilities in students to enable them to relate the use of knowledge in real life situations.

The members met periodically and subcommittees were formed for focused activities. This document is the Annual Quality Assurance Report of the IQAC as adopted in its meeting held on 5th August 2010.

Part A

2.0 Pre-instructional/ pre admission planning

The basic road map for the academic year was drawn from the report of IQAC, the peer team report of accreditation and the extended project for College with Potential for Excellence. The thrust areas were

- i) Implementation of recommendations of the peer team in their report of re-accreditation.
- ii) The Road map drawn by the college in the implementation of CPE project
- iii) To promote the ICT based instructions

- iv) To inculcate quality perspectives in teaching and learning
- v) To prepare for the third cycle of accreditation

2.1 Post re-accreditation agenda and status

The master plan was envisaged during the re-accreditation exercise and the following target areas for development were selected:

- 1) **Curricular Plan:**
To provide a wide range of programmes for the students to enable them to develop their full potential and emerge as well rounded personalities. In accordance with this, the regular and self financing courses worked in tandem with each other.
- 2) **Teaching-learning, Research and Consultancy:**
Adjunct professors for research areas in subjects such as Chemistry have been appointed and larger collaborations with institutions/industry in India and abroad have been initiated. Faculty exchange programs are envisaged and projects funded by UGC, DBT, DST have been completed.
- 3) **Infrastructure and learning facilities:**
To develop ICT as teaching communication, publications and out-reach platform, build a sports complex, extend the research facilities, enhance financial support system to students and to develop the Multimedia facility. The College proposes to install the facility of web conferencing to enhance the quality of teaching by connecting with eminent academicians.
- 4) **Student support and progression:**
To create student mentorship in the students' community, develop students' news bulletin, develop systems for student participation in performance audit and develop corpus fund for students to meet emergencies.
- 5) **Organization and management/ healthy practices:**
To create of corpus fund for development and welfare; thus creating an atmosphere for autonomous institution. Further, to motivate staff and students in basic and applied research and training.

Part B

3.0 Implementation of Peer Team Report as on 2005-06

1) Curricular plan:

The year 2009- 10 was celebrated in Maharashtra as its golden jubilee year. Vaze College staff thought it befitting to commemorate this occasion by organizing a two day state level conference entitled Imaging the Past, Envisioning the Future, in January 2010.

The academic calendar was affected by a teachers' strike that lasted 43 days from July 14, 2009 to August 27, 2009. Full time permanent teachers participated whole heartedly in the strike, while temporary teachers continued to engage in lectures. Since the college has a large number of permanent teachers, very few classes could be engaged. At the withdrawal of the strike, a fresh academic calendar was prepared. The terms were extended to ensure that the number of teaching days were completed as per the regular pattern. The term end examination generally conducted in the month of October was rescheduled to December.

Further the outbreak of swine flu in Mumbai and other parts of the state impacted the academic year.

The first batch of Bachelors degree in Mass Media graduated this year. The batch took admission to TYBMM in 2008-09. The results of this batch announced in the academic year 2009 - 2010 were very encouraging with a 100% result and more than 86% students securing a first class.

2) *Teaching-learning, Research and consultancy:*

14 research scholars pursuing a doctoral programme in College submitted their theses to the University of Mumbai. This is a record of the largest number of theses to be submitted from any single institution to the University in one academic year. A number of research papers have also been published this year. The CPE tenure ended in 2007. However, after a high level UGC Peer Team and LIC review, the project for CPE is extended for further for the second year for research and training. The Bioremediation project continued in collaboration with civic body TMC.

3) *Infrastructure and learning facilities:*

The College is equipped with the state of art laboratories for Plant Tissue Culture, Animal Tissue Culture, Molecular Biology and Physiology. The facilities and the existing structure available in these laboratories have been upgraded. The ICT concept is further adopted. The web- enabled teaching will be enhanced in due course of time. Increased number power point presentations by students and teachers were reported this year. The teachers were provided with the facility of using ICT in class room presentations whenever demanded. The multimedia centre is already in use. It is equipped with the internet facility and a smart board. The internet facility has been extended to several departments as well as the Staff Common Room.

4) *Student support and progression:*

The Students' Council has been very active in the College. The Council organized a programme titled 'Meet The Principal' wherein the students had the opportunity to interact freely with the Principal. This was in the form of suggestions and discussions pertaining to issues related to the students. An open

platform that provides for free expression of students' opinions is well received by all.

5) *Organization and management/ healthy practices:*

- There was a change in leadership with the incumbent Principal opting for voluntary retirement and a new Principal taking charge. The College has a policy of appointing, from among its senior faculty, a new Vice Principal every three years. A new librarian was appointed in lieu of the librarian who superannuated. The Local Managing Committee was reconstituted for the next five years i.e. 2009 – 2014. The new teacher representatives are Mr. Jayprakash Sutar, Dr. Preeta Nilesh and Mr. Anil Naik.
- The teachers were aware of the fact that the strike would adversely affect the students' academic year. Hence the loss of teaching days was compensated for by the teachers by curtailing the Diwali vacation from three weeks to four days. Further, there was no winter break for Christmas. The second term extended into the second week of May. This ensured that the number of working days in the second term were adequate and as per the norms of the University. Thus, despite the teachers' strike, the students were unaffected at the end of the academic year.
- The teaching and non teaching staff of the College was called upon for rendering services in the conduct of the Lok Sabha and the State Vidhan Sabha elections. Several training sessions were attended by the staff members and they participated whole heartedly in the national duty.

3.5: Curricular design and transaction

Vaze College teachers are members of University Bodies such as the Unfair Means Committee. Four senior faculty are members of the Board of Studies of the University of Mumbai while one is on the Board of Studies of S.N.D.T University. Many of the faculty members are members of the University syllabus revision committees of various subjects. One teacher is a member of the Indian Chemical Society of India. Almost all staff members are on various Interview panels for selection and career advancement of Lecturers in the different colleges of the University.

Eight research guides are involved in guiding the students for PhD, M. Phil and MSc by research degree in the subject of Botany, Zoology, Economics, Biotechnology, Chemistry and History. The College has the largest number of recognized guides in the Departments of Biological Sciences in the University of Mumbai. These departments also have the largest number of students registered for doctoral research in the University of Mumbai.

In the academic year 2009 – 10 as many as 14 research students submitted their doctoral dissertations and theses to the university. This is the largest number of theses to be submitted by a single institution to the university in one academic year, Some of the faculty members are recognized PG teachers and actively involved in taking lectures at University for PG Classes.

Several colleges from the vicinity have a tie up the College for the course of M.Sc. IT and resources and faculty of all colleges are shared for the same. The College functions as the center for this programme. Students from various colleges avail of the facilities offered by the College.

4.1 Faculty Development Programme

Two faculty members, Mrs. M K Shanta and Mr Ajit Kengar have been granted leave under the UGC XI Plan, to pursue their Ph. D studies.

UGC Funding:

The college has received 42,00,000/- from UGC as Basic Research facility grant for Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Botany, Information Technology and Zoology departments.

4.2.1: The college is actively involved in research projects with a funding of more than Rs. 20 Lac from different agencies like UGC, DBT, DST, ICSSR, University of Mumbai etc. There are research consulting projects sponsored by industry and civic bodies.

The scientific research center continues work on a DBT project for which it has received a grant of Rs.10 lac. Cosmetology and testing laboratory is engaged in corporate consultancy. The center for Advanced Research in Natural and Synthetic Chemistry is involved in collaboration with WHO. Dr. Mrs Bhatt is an adjunct professor the college.

The College was identified as a College with Potential for Excellence from 2004 – 2007 under which it received a grant of more than Rs. 60, 00000, the grant has been utilized fully and faculty is actively involved in research and guiding activities. Thereafter, the grant was further extended in the year 2007-08 and 2008 -09 during which Rs. 35 lacs and Rs. 42 lacs were granted.

6.1 NSS: Community services unit is active and constantly contributing to the social needs. It has also secured a prominent place in university of Mumbai. Several programmes were conducted to bring about AIDS/ HIV and health awareness. Various other programmes, rallies, camps and skits/talks were arranged in which the students' participation was inter-active.

Community Service: Ten members of the non teaching staff were sent on deputation for a period of one year to the election office, Mumbai to assist in the conduct of the Lok Sabha and the Vidhan Sabha elections. All the staff members with the exception of the principal and the Registrar were assigned election duty for Lok Sabha and Vidhan Sabha elections.

6.2: Teachers and officers newly recruited:

New teachers were recruited on contract basis in lieu of teachers who are on leave under the Faculty Improvement Programme.

7.0 Library:

The college library has a collection of 48241 books. It subscribes to 65 journals and magazines. During the academic year, more than 2400 books and 03 journals were added to the collection. These were purchased through the various grants for the library:

Remedial coaching:

Remedial coaching has been an ongoing activity of the college for the last two years to assist the weak students of the SC and ST of various classes in improving their learning skills. The students who want to attend such coaching were also allowed. The response

was encouraging initially but decreased at the end of the academic year. A team of faculty has been assigned to look into this matter.

7.1 Computerization of library:

The library has upgraded the library automation software from SOUL 1.0 to SOUL 2.0. The circulation and serials will be implemented soon. New computer terminals are functional and enable the smooth and efficient functioning of the library. The Assistant Librarian who has been trained for this purpose oversees this functioning.

7.1.1: Computerization of administration: The college is committed to bring in automation in administration. It is developing the ERP software with the help of available human resources and infrastructure. Currently

- i) Admissions, fees collection, receipting has been computerized
- ii) Payroll is fully computerized
- vi) Accounts section, administration is on separate local area network. While there is a separate network for examination related work and library. The Internet connectivity is provided to these networks.
- vii) Additional computer setup with four PCs was initiated for automation in University related work of enrolment, admissions etc
- viii) The computer laboratories have their separate network with internet connectivity
- ix) The faculty room has separate computer with Internet and library access.

The college has its own website maintained by professionals. It is constantly being updated to make it a tool for dissemination of information.

7.2: Addition of infrastructure:

Due to frequent power cut and load shedding, a separate diesel generator of 100 KVA has been installed to ensure continuous power supply to laboratories and essential utilities. The efforts are made to cut down the consumption of electricity by using eco-friendly devices. Students are informed about the importance of saving of electricity.

8.1: Parent teacher association:

A parent teacher get-together is organized on 15th August every year. It is an annual feature of the college to invite as Chief Guest one of the parents of the student who has secured admission to the college during the year. This enables us to understand the expectations that the society has from us and simultaneously assists us in reaching out to them. Over the years we have found this to be an extremely fruitful exercise. However, this year the function could not be organized due to the spread of swine flu and the state government directive to keep educational institutions closed and restrain from organizing public events.

8.2: Student achievement and awards:

- Ms. Vidya Menon was awarded the first prize at Avishkar, the Inter University Research Festival held at Solapur in the category of Pure Science.

- NSS team participated at state level camps and leadership training programmes. They organized rallies and street skits, blood donation camps, drug addiction awareness camp, consumer guidance camp, Sunday camps, helped NGOs in Pulse Polio camps, Pratham project, peace rally etc.

8.3: Placement services:

The career and placement services committee is helping the present students to make the best of career options available to them. More than 400 students registered themselves with the Cell for placements. A Two day workshop on personality development was organized. Several reputed companies such as WNS Global Services, Ariston Capital Services, Wipro BPO, Patni Computers, The Thane Janata Sahakari Bank, Citi Technology Services, JP Morgan Chase, Accenture and Adnet Infosystem and others recruited fresh graduates from all the faculties of the college. Career Exhibition entitled “Career in Arts and Commerce” was organized by the Placement Cell

8.4: Scholarships:

The College awarded Government Open Merit scholarships to more than 200 students while 160 students belonging to the reserved categories were awarded scholarships.

9.1: Linkages developed with National/International, academic and research bodies:

The college is recognized as one the leading academic institution in University of Mumbai and Maharashtra. The college has continued to render its services to Thane Municipal Corporation in terms of consultancy for Bioremediation of their lakes. The advanced research lab is working for the WHO project. The college has provided technology to farmers for cultivation of Patchouli plant. This experiment proved to be successful and many more farmers are eager to come forward to increase the cultivation.

There is a MOU between the French Institution ISIPCA and the Kelkar Education Trust to conduct such a unique PG course in Perfumery and Cosmetics. Faculty exchange program is actively under consideration of the management.

9.2: In memorium:

The Chairman of Kelkar Education Trust Shri Govind D. Kelkar alias Bhausahab Kelkar left for the heavenly abode on 2nd March 2010. The Management, Staff and students of Vaze College will deeply miss his presence amidst us, but his vision will continue to be the guiding force in our future endeavours.
